

ABF INAUGURATION | May 21, 2009



he groundbreaking event of American Business Forum was held on May 21, 2009 at Pearl Continental Lahore. US Ambassador to Pakistan, Anne W. Patterson, graced the Inauguration of the Forum with her kind presence. This prestigious event was also attended by CEOs of ABF Member companies along with their Directors & Senior Executives. ABF invitees included Federal Mister for Investment Senator Waqar Ahmed, Chief Minister Punjab representative Sardar Zulfiqar Ali Khosa, Advisor to Chief Minister Pervaiz

Malik, Bryan D Hunt, Principal Officer to US Consulate in Lahore, Federal and Provincial Secretaries and other dignitaries. Huge media presence covered this exclusive event.

The program started with the recitation of Holy Quran by Mr. Mahmood Ahmad, Honorary Secretary General ABF, followed by a welcome note by MC of the event, Mr. Salim Ghauri, Senior Vice President ABF. Rizwan U. Khan, the first president of ABF welcomed the Chief Guest with a brief introduction of the Forum, its mission and vision. He then highlighted the extensive and historical ties between U.S. origin businesses and Pakistan. He pointed out that U.S. by itself takes up 25 percent of Pakistan's total exports. Further he said that U.S. businesses in Pakistan have made substantial contribution over several decades to the Pakistan economy, in terms of investment, contribution to the national exchequer in the form of taxes and duties, creation of direct and indirect employment, transfer of technology, human resource capacity building, growth impetus to vendor industries and even as being a catalyst for other foreign direct investment. He also called upon the government of Pakistan to effectively address the various problems being faced by U.S. businesses in Pakistan, with violations of intellectual property rights being one of the biggest threats to both existing business and to future investment.

In his speech, Mr. Waqar Ahmad Khan, Federal Minister of Investment congratulated members of ABF and assured the gathering that he will facilitate businesses in their endeavors. Sardar Zulfiqar Ali Khosa on behalf of Chief Minister welcomed



the formation of ABF and pledged Punjab Government support to ABF in every possible manner.

U.S. Ambassador to Pakistan, Anne W. Patterson, in her address said that the establishment of ABF is a positive signal and we welcome this initiative. Talking about the launch of the Forum, she added that it is a positive step that over 30 US companies which are members of ABF are contributing towards the economy of the country and that ABF can

play an important and effective role in strengthening relations between Pakistan and US. The Ambassador said that Pakistan is an attractive destination for investment despite multiple challenges and problems. Highlighting this point further, she added that U.S. itself has made direct investment of 103 billion dollars in Pakistan during 2007-8, U.S. was Pakistan largest partner and was purchaser of 25 percent overall exports of Pakistan.

She told Pakistan would acquire capability of 3000-megawatt power generation in the next. 12 months with the cooperation of US. Speaking on the IDPs issue she indicated that U.S. would contribute 110 million dollars for IDPs. Further, U.S. would provide all possible assistance to help resolve the problems facing Pakistan including Swat and Malakand.

Speeches were followed by certificate distribution ceremony in which members were awarded membership certificates by the Chief Guest. As a token of thanks, H.E. Anne W. Patterson, H.E. Bryan Hunt and H.E. Zulfiqar Khosa were presented mementos by the Executive Committee of American Business Forum. This was followed by an appetizing lunch which was enjoyed by the guests.

Mr. Rizwan U. Khan, Country Manager Coca-Cola Export Corporation, while talking to GEO TV expressed his views regarding the Internally Displaced People of Swat and Mardan. He told the media that his company has pledged a total of Rs. 20 million for IDPs. Apart from that they are donating a water filtration plant to Mir Khalil ur Rehman Foundation for the affectees.

Being a part of corporate sector himself, Mr. Rizwan said that our philosophy is that companies should be an integral part of the community in which they are operating. Corporate sector has the required expertise and the resources so they should take the lead and donate generously. He further told the media that American Business Forum member companies are quite keen in helping the IDPs and are working with different NGOs in this regard. He emphasized and urged companies, individuals and even children to unify and realize what tough times our nation is going through.

Elaborating on the strategy which Coca-Cola has adopted, he said that they will contribute in three main steps. First one would be the immediate help in form of medicines, clean drinking water and food. Next focus would be on education and in this regard they will be working with Care Foundation and other institutions associated

with education. Last but not the least their focus would be to facilitate the rehabilitation of people when they return to their native homes.
